THOSE FANCY PANTS PIRATES



Back in the day . . . Pirates sailed the seas and relieved many seafaring sailors of their ships, their cargos and their parrots. They sailed under a Jolly Roger flag which often times got them into a not so jolly imprisonment. Today, their escapades provide us with lots of material for thrilling stories, movies and jolly good times. This summer Pirates will visit Deer Lake to teach and entertain Cub Scouts, Webeelos Scouts and their partners about life on the high seas and how to party down on landlubbers' shores. There will be songs sung, crafts and skills taught along with plenty of good food and beverage served to ensure the party goes on.

Cub Scout/Webeelos Scout summer resident camp will be conducted at our newly completed Cub camping facility at Deer Lake in Killingworth, Connecticut. This facility is designed with the young camper and his partner in mind. With inside facilities, gorgeous dining hall and campsites outfitted with comfortable lean-tos – it's the right place for an introduction to the great outdoors.

Archery, BB guns and air rifles, paddling a canoe or kayak, fishing, camping, handicrafts and field sports and assistance in completing various advancement requirements of their Scouting program are all available to Scouts at resident camp. In addition to an all day funfest of age appropriate activities, participants will be engaged in a camp-wide theme related seafaring adventure.

There are a total of six sessions to choose from: three sessions for Cub Scouts and Webeelos (boys entering the 2nd through 5th grade) and two sessions for Webeelos (boys entering 4th or 5th grade) only. All sessions will have the same Pirate theme but with more or less time for having fun. Sailors can sign on for any one of the four 4-day sessions or any one of the two 3-day sessions – or as many sessions as they would like. A special session for family camping is also scheduled (see session 5 for details).

The fee for all Cub Scout Resident Camp sessions includes T-shirts (excepting Session 5 Family Camp), patches, all meals, program supplies and an incredible staff to ensure you enjoy your camp experience.

Camperships: The Council is committed to the principle that every Scout deserves a summer camp experience. Campership assistance is available to all. Applications must be submitted along with a registration form and a \$50 non-refundable deposit. If a full campership is approved the deposit will be refunded. If a partial campership is awarded, the difference must be paid before July 1, 2013. Contact your unit leader or visit our Council website for an application. Campership applications are due May 15.

Refund Policy: Each session requires a \$50 non-refundable deposit. 100% of the remainder is refundable if requested before June 30, 2013. Camp fee minus \$150 if withdrawal is made on or after July 1, 2013. Refund requests must be made in writing to the Camp Director. No refund requests will be accepted after August 31. Refund Request Forms are available on the Council website at www.ctyankee.org.

Health & Safety: The camp Health Lodge is staffed with trained medical providers (either a nurse or first aider depending on camp enrollment). Connecticut Yankee Council complies with all State and BSA requirements for youth camps.

Health Forms: Each attendee, scout and adult alike, is required to have a physical taken within the past 12 months. A BSA required physical form is on the website, www.ctyankee.org/camping/residentcamp/cubscout. Part D, a Connecticut Yankee Council addendum is required to meet State of Connecticut standards and must accompany the Scout's physical.

Check-In/Check-Out: Check-in for all camp sessions is no later than 9:00 AM at the Deer Lake Dining Hall. Check out is 3:00 PM on the last day of camp.

How to Register: You may attend with a unit (Pack or Den) or as an individual Scout and partner. If you want to attend with your unit, contact your unit leadership for guidance. If you are attending as a lone Scout with partner, applications are available on the Connecticut Yankee Council website or you can call Carolyn, (203) 876-6868, ext. 273, at the Milford Scout Office. Preferably a Scout attends with his parent (one on one) but no more than three Cub Scouts or four Webelos may attend with one adult. A registration form and helpful information is available at:
